A CAPPELLA THROUGH THE AGES is our theme as we sing an intriguing selection of music from a diverse repertoire—Medieval, Renaissance, Baroque, Early American; 19th-and 20th-century part-songs; rounds, hymns, and folk-songs; jazz, pop, doo-wop, and improvisations. As always, anything goes from Gesualdo to Gershwin!

NOT YOUR AVERAGE CHORAL WORKSHOP. What makes a Western Wind workshop unique is the focus on small ensembles. In small groups, everyone makes an essential contribution. This develops your listening and blending skills, and encourages you to display and develop your unique vocal personality and share your musical insights.

A TYPICAL DAY begins with warm-ups led by The Western Wind. This is followed by a short rehearsal of a large group piece sung by the entire workshop. Most of the day is spent in small ensembles, working on a variety of a cappella and continuo-accompanied repertoire depending on the interests, desires and voicing of the group.

Optional activities include English country dancing, vocal improvisation, duos and trios with continuo, pop and jazz ensembles, and open reading sessions. Or if you'd like to relax, you can have a walkthrough Smith's lovely campus or a take a "dip" at a local swimming hole.

After dinner, everyone gathers to share the day's work. Here you receive feedback from all six members of The Western Wind and guest faculty. When the day is finished, participants gather at the dorm to socialize, exchange stories, play games, or collapse in bed after an exhilarating day of music-making.

MEALS

Fresh and nutritious meals are served on campus. Meals for the weekend workshops begin with breakfast on Saturday and end with dinner on Sunday. Meals for 5-day participants begin with breakfast on Tuesday and end with dinner on Saturday. Meals for 8-day participants include three meals from Saturday to Friday, and breakfast and lunch on the following Saturday. (Many participants like to eat out together on the final Saturday evening.) Dietary requests are honored and should be requested in advance.

REGISTRATION AND FEES

Advance registration is required. Enroll online at www.westernwind.org or by completing the application below and mailing it with your deposit to The Western Wind. (Please note that participants taking both Session I and Session II 8-day or 5-day workshops will receive a 20% tuition discount for each workshop. There is also a tuition discount available to all participants who register

before May 29, 2018 for Session I and before July 3, 2018 for Session II.) Balances due are paid upon arrival. A letter of acknowledgment containing information about the program will be emailed upon receipt of your deposit.

Full refunds are made for cancellations received prior to May 28 for Session I, and July 2 for Session II. From May 29-June 12 for Session I and July 3-July 18 for Session II, a cancellation fee of 50% of the deposit will be

charged to cover administrative costs. Deposit is forfeited if cancellation is made within 15 days of workshop start date. If the workshop is cancelled or postponed, neither Smith College nor The Western Wind is responsible for any related costs, charges, or expenses, including cancellation/change charges assessed by airlines or travel agencies.

Smith College is within easy driving distance (two-anda-half to three hours) of New York and Boston. The Peter Pan Bus line operates daily service to Northampton from New York City and Boston. Amtrak also serves Northampton from New York City. Both the bus terminal and the Amtrak station are within walking distance of the dorm. Bradley International Airport in Windsor Locks, Connecticut, services all major airlines and is a 45-minute drive from the campus.

5-day and 8-day participants residing in the dorm can arrange to stay the evening of July 7 or August 11 for a modest additional charge.

THE WESTERN WIND has played a major role in presenting the special beauty and variety of a cappella vocal music since 1969. The sextet's repertoire reveals its wideranging interests--from Renaissance motets to fifties rock 'n' roll, from medieval carols to vocal jazz, from complex works by avant-garde composers to simple folk

In the U.S. The Western Wind has been featured at many distinguished venues, including Lincoln Center, Kennedy Center, Carnegie Hall, UCLA, the Cleveland Museum of Art, the Eastman School of Music, and the Metropolitan Museum of Art. The Western Wind has been featured at the national convention of the American Choral Directors Association, at the Georgia, Illinois, Wisconsin and Nebraska Choral Directors state conventions, and at the Eastern Division regional convention. Abroad The Western Wind performed and gave workshops in Sydney Australia, at the Grand Théâtre de Genève in Geneva, Switzerland and at the Hokutopia International Festival in Tokyo. The Western Wind has also appeared at Venice's legendary Teatro La Fenice, the Rome Opera, and at various festivals throughout northern Italy. **Recordings** The Western Wind is widely known for its performances of Philip Glass's film scores for Koyaanisqatsi and Candyman, and for its many recordings which include The Man in the Moon, My Funny Valentine; The Rose of Sharon; The Happy Journey; Angel Voices; Christmas in the New World; Taste of Eternity—A Musical Shabbat; Birthday of the World (Music for the High Holy Days), Part I and Part II; Blessings & Batéy; The Chanukkah Story; Chanukkah in Story and Song; The Passover Story; Mazal Bueno: A Portrait in Song of the Spanish Jews; O Western Wind: An (almost) A Cappella Songbook, and Holiday Light: Singing Angels, Silver Bells, Basket Rondo by Meredith Monk and Jukebox in the Tavern of Love by Eric Salzman (two extended works written for the ensemble) and most recently We Are Still Here: The Holocaust Through Music & Memory in an all-music version and a radio version with a narration performed by Danny Burstein and Jessica Hecht. Many of these recordings were created as radio programs and were distributed by NPR and PRI. Publications The Western Wind has published its repertoire with Shawnee Press, Broude Brothers, Oxford University Press, Colla Voce, Transcontinental, Shadowpress Publications, and Aria Publications
